### **Deborah Riccardi**

#### Woman in Art and Their Influences

Deborah Riccardi attended the University of Pennsylvania receiving a MFA, Temple Tyler School of Art, BFA, accredited courses Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, and The Barnes Foundation where she was a Teacher, Interim Director of Education, and Head of the Docent Programs. Deborah teaches a diverse curriculum such as Art Appreciation, Art History periods including Paleolithic to Modern Art, Fine Arts, Graphic Arts, since 2002. She is currently working more than full-time at four different colleges. She is a painter, teacher and lecturer. She spent the beginning of her professional career at The Barnes Foundation starting in 1988 as a student and later became the Acting Interim Director of Education, Head of the Docent Program, School Visitation Program, French International School, Elderhostel Program, Special Lecturer, Lecturer and Inventory Manager of the Collections including Ker-Feal, Haywood and much more. She has years of research experience from the actual masterpieces and archives at The Barnes Foundation. She also was the private lecturer for leaders of the Museum such as Louvre, ELF Corporation, and Pew Foundation.

Her world travels include London, Paris, Rome, Provence, Avignon, Switzerland, and Ireland, lecturing on collections throughout Europe with college students. She has been a member of the Philadelphia Sketch Club since before 2000, where she has worked in archives, chaired exhibitions, hung the 150th Anniversary Exhibit and exhibited her work. She has traveled on missions' trips to Papua New Guinea and Haiti as an artist and photographer. Recently, she traveled to Guatemala to build water filters and stoves. These experiences have influenced her spiritual, visual and philosophical perceptions. Deborah went from "knowing about something on a mission field intellectually to actually experiencing it." Now she paints these experiences. She has exhibited her works in galleries in Israel, New York City, Philadelphia, Delaware, New Jersey and College Galleries. Her work is in many private collections as well. Deborah quotes: "I realize now that I have come to an "impasse" in my life and work."


