Painting with dirt

Marlene works with hands-on programs for children and adult groups with POPCI — environmental and social history programs to museum groups. Marlene continues to offer social history, environmental and creative programs as requested. Combining her art and science interests, Marlene has conducted hands-



on, minds-on workshops and programs for schools, groups and events such as the Earth Day Festival at Smithville Historic Site and the Delaware River Sojourn.

PAINT WITH NEW JERSEY DIRT - Paint with Dirt to Celebrate the Earth



Participants will paint a design on cardboard using the many colors of dirt found in New Jersey. They will discover that each color was created at a different time and represents a different geological formation in this state. There are red, green, brown, yellow and black soils in different geological layers. Each participant will receive a New Jersey geological map showing where each of the soils are found and something about how they were formed.

Participants will use glue to "draw" the design on cardboard, then cover it with his/her dirt choices. Possibly embellishing with shore shells or river pebbles as available.

Finished masterpieces, which will be wet, will be slipped into (recycled) plastic bags for easy carrying and full protection.
